



2021 - 2022 – GOALS AND OBJECTIVES

*Target adjusted due to resurgence of COVID-19 and Virtual Online Learning

Goal #1 – Academic Performance:	The UC TEAMS Charter School will demonstrate improved academic performance in both Math and ELA on NJSLA and/or Start Strong (statewide assessments).
Measure	Growth in percentage of students demonstrating proficiency in school-wide assessments by June 2022.
Target	*70% or better of all students will increase 10 – 15% age points on Statewide Assessments
Actual Outcome	NA – there was no post to Start Strong and Spring 2022 was the first since Spring 2019 for NJSLA. No Comparative Study.

Goal #1 A Academic Performance:	The UC TEAMS Charter School will demonstrate improved academic performance in District Assessments, i.e., Link-It Benchmarks, DRAs K - 5, and unit assessments in Math and ELA, (Savvas RealizeK-12 Curriculum) for grades K – 11.
Measure	Growth in percentage of students demonstrating proficiency in school-wide assessments by June 2022.
Target	*70% or better of all students will increase 10 – 15% on all District Assessments from pre to post.
Actual Outcome	Target Met and Exceeded in All Grades Tested both Pre-and Post.

Goal #2 – Dual High School College Performance:	The UC TEAMS Charter School will provide all eligible students in the High School/College Leadership Academy an opportunity to participate in the dual high school/college Bridge Program off site at Middlesex County College.
Measure	Growth in percentage of courses passed and taken on the college campus by June 2022.
Target	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> *• 75% of all eligible Juniors and Seniors will be enrolled in the dual high school/college Bridge Programs. *• 80% or better of students taking courses in the Bridge Program will pass all courses taken in both semesters.
Actual Outcome	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 90% of students taking courses in the Bridge Program passed all courses taken. Target Met and Exceeded. • Only 70% of all eligible Juniors and Seniors were enrolled in dual high school/college Bridge Program in the Fall/Spring of 2021. (Target Not Met due to absences and contact tracing as a result of COVID-19.)

Goal #3 – High School Graduation:	The UC TEAMS Charter School will provide opportunities for students in grades 9 – 12 to successfully meet the high school graduation requirements as outlined by the district in accordance with state guidelines.
Measure	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • *Maintain 90 - 100 percent high school graduation. • Maintain 100 percent of a minimum of two acceptances to a two year or four year college/university program and/or trade certificated program by June 2022.
Target	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • *90 - 100% graduation rate. • *90 - 100% of all seniors will demonstrate acceptances mentioned above.
Actual Outcome	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 100% Graduation Rate for the Class of 2022. Target Met. • 97% of all seniors were accepted to two or more colleges/universities and/or trade schools. Target Exceeded.

Goal #4 – STEM Focus: (Grades K - 12)	The UC TEAMS Charter School will demonstrate increased project based learning in all curricular programs: General, STEM - Extended Day Program, and provide an effective and competitive school-wide “Built Environment Science/STEM Fair” with a focus on solutions to climate change.
Measure	To provide opportunities for project-based learning in all curricular programs: General, STEM Extended Day Program, and create an effective and competitive school-wide “Built Environment Science Fair”.
Target	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • *Reintroduce Built Environment STEM Fair 2022 with a focus on science in Spring 2022 using project based entries. • Use Scientists and other professionals as the judges with increased monetary prizes by June 2022.
Actual Outcome	Not Attempted due to COVID-19.

Goal #5 – Pathway to Graduation	The High School/College Leadership Academy will increase graduation requirements via PSAT/SAT standardized assessment. (9-12)
Measure	Show growth in the number of students graduating through the pathway of PSAT and SAT.
Target	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> *60% or better of seniors will show an average of 25 points increase from test to test. *40% or better of all seniors will use the PSAT/SAT/NJSLA as the pathway to meet assessment standards in either ELA or Math for graduation by June 2022.
Actual Outcome	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The increase from test to test not measured in the absence of tests given in regular intervals due to COVID-19. (SAT/NJSLA not available) • 64% of all seniors used the PSAT/SAT/NJSLA as the pathway to meet assessment standards in either ELA or MATH. Target was Met and Exceeded.
