SANITIZE AND SIGN IN

Students and Staff must sanitize and sign in each day and sign out upon leaving the building.

MASKS/FACE COVERINGS

Masks or face coverings are required to be worn while in the building at ALL TIMES.



ENTRANCE TO BUILDINGS - STAFF

The school day begins at 7:45am for all staff. SBC Campus use the Liberty Street Entrance and SMC Campus use or the West Sixth Street to enter and the building. The school day ends at *3:45pm*.



ENTRANCE AND EXITS TO BUILDINGS STUDENTS - SBC CAMPUS

Breakfast begins at 7:15am and entrance is at the 4th Street Door.

K-5 Enter at 4th Street Door

K - 2 EXIT VSU2 (CAC)

3 – 5 EXIT 4TH Street Door

6 – 8 Enter and Exit Liberty Street

9 -12 Enter the Main Door and use designated stairwells. (SMC Campus)



TEMPERATURE TAKEN

Each day, staff and students will have their temperatures taken and must be cleared of the following symptoms: Fever, Cough, Chills and/or Shortness of breath. Those exhibiting these symptoms will be sent to the nurse's office to return home to see their physician and possible testing for COVID-19. Medical clearance required for return.



- Isolate and send home if internal temperature is over 100.4°F (38°C)
- When ill, student parents will be called to come and pick up child who will be isolated from other students at the nurse's office entrance.
- · Confidentiality will be maintained.
- Spaces to enter the building and designated entrances and exit flow paths have been established.
- · Visitors are **ONLY** allowed at security and must wear masks at all times. (Staff and/or Students will meet them there.



SOCIAL (PHYSICAL) DISTANCING

Staff and students members are asked to stay **three feet apart** wherever possible.

All classrooms have desk shields and shields at teacher desks.



VENTILATION

ALL CLASSROOMS ARE OUTFITTED WITH THE FOLLOWING:

- WINDOW AIR CONDITION UNITS OR
- CENTRAL AIR CONDITIONING
- UNIT AIR PURIFICATION SYSTEMS
- STUDENTS IN LOWER GRADES ENJOY OUTDOOR RECESS



SANITITATION

· Hand soap and hand sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol, paper towels, and no-touch trash cans in all bathrooms, classrooms, and frequently trafficked areas are provided.



HYDRATION

- · Water fountains are turned off and bottled water is provided DAILY in homerooms and at lunch.
- · Ensure ventilation systems operate properly
- Conduct deep cleaning of schools prior to students/staff returning.
- Sanitize and disinfect with osha approved solution at the close of school each day once students and staff have cleared the building.



SIGNAGE

- · Signage in classrooms, hallways, and entrances to communicate how to stop the spread.
- COVID-19 symptoms, preventative measures (including staying home when sick), good hygiene, and school/district specific protocols are posted.
- Bathroom usage, no more than two people in the bathroom at one time.
- · Signs indicating handwashing required after use.



LUNCH

- Students are escorted to lunch and only five students per table.
- Each student must sign in daily at their table.
- Lunch table assignments are dated and archived in the event they are needed for Contact Tracing.
- Masks are lowered to eat and, if not eating, must remain on during the lunch period.



TRANSITIONING

- Stairwells have been assigned to various clusters and they never move at the same time.
- Students always walk to the right.
- K 5 use Achievers Avenue stairwell. This keeps students separate and minimizes contact.
- 6-8 use Scholar's Way stairwell
- 9 12 Designated stairwells for up and down usage: Associates Ave, Bachelor's Blvd. Master's Street, and Doctor's Drive.



PROTECTING VULNERABLE POPULATIONS

- Any vulnerable students and staff must check in daily with administration.
- Early transition and/or elevator use is allowed for vulnerable students to go to classes
- Limit large group gatherings/interactions.
- If necessary, reassign high-risk staff to other roles that can be done from home (such as remote tutoring or mentoring).
