Kindergarten Suggested Reading Activities

Here are some activities you can do with your child to improve their vocabulary and reading skills. You can just choose one or two to complete each time you read.

Before Reading:

• Find in the book: front cover, back cover, spine and title page.

• Tell the job of: the author (writes the book) and illustrator (draws the pictures).

• Take a picture walk (only looking at the pictures, not reading any words) and make a prediction (guess) about what the story is about.

During Reading:

• Echo read: You read a sentence and have your child read the same sentence, repeating what you read.

• Choral read: Read the book out loud with your child from beginning to end.

• Partner read: You read a page, or a sentence, and then have your child read the next.

After Reading:

• Summarize: Talk about what the book is about. Discuss the characters and setting.

• Discusses any connections you may have to the book.

• Letter detective: give your child a specific letter to find in the book. Have them count how many they found.

• Sight word detective: have your child ind (and read) as many sight words as they can in the book.

• Look at the punctuation in the book. Find a period, question mark or an exclamation mark.

• Find the first word on a page, the last word, and count how many pages in the book.

• Have your child draw a picture and write a sentence about what the book was about or their flavorite part.
